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The 2010 Utah Priorities Survey of Party Delegates and Voters

Survey conducted April 13-20, 2010 by Dan Jones and Associates

As part of the 2010 Utah Priorities Project, Utah Foundation, KSL Television and Radio, Deseret News, and the Hinckley Institute sponsored a ground-breaking survey of Utah voters and delegates to the major party state conventions. The survey shows distinct differences between party delegates and voters, with delegates usually taking more zealous positions than their party's voters. But the strongest distinctions are, as expected, between the two major parties. The survey also provides insight on Republican delegates' opinions in the contentious U.S. Senate race.

In February, Utah Foundation surveyed registered voters to determine their top issues of concern for this election year. In this new survey conducted in April, the questions were revised to be more clear about voters' priorities for action by elected officials. One challenge with the February survey was that it asked how concerned voters were about each issue, and voters may be concerned because they want action on an issue or because they do not want action. For example, on healthcare, many conservatives did not want to see implementation of the action proposed by Congress and the President. On the topic of government spending, some voters may be concerned that spending is too high and others may be concerned that it is too low, especially when budgets have been cut because of the slow economy.

In the April survey, the questions were phrased to be more focused on areas where voters and convention delegates want to see action. Instead of asking respondents to "rate how concerned you are about each of the following issues," the survey asked "how important are the following for the State of Utah's elected officials to address?"

This survey was directed at three primary populations: the general population of likely voters, Republican Party state convention delegates, and Democratic Party state convention delegates. In addition, the general voting population can be divided among those who are registered Republicans, Democrats, and those unaffiliated with a party.

The survey was conducted April 13-20, 2010 by Dan Jones and Associates, with a sample of 608 likely voters, 526 Republican Party state delegates, and 548 Democratic Party state delegates. Likely voters were defined as registered voters who voted in the 2008 general election. The margin of error for the likely voter sample is +/-4.17% at the 95% confidence level, and the delegate samples had margins of error less than 4%. However, caution must be exercised with using the Democrat voter segment of the likely voter survey, because it was very small and will have much larger sampling variability (margin of error) than the other groups.

Following are the questions and detailed results from the Dan Jones survey.

In this poll, we will ask many of the questions on a 1-7 scale. Please remember that “4” is the mid-point or neutral-point in a 1-7 scale.
